What we are accomplishing in two days:

- 1) Clearing out rooms in order to do construction and painting
- 2) Patching walls
- 3) Painting of nine rooms
- 4) New large custom pantry
- 5) Installation of doors (4)
- 6) Moving, removing, adding, repairing, fabricating furniture, toy boxes, book shelves
- 7) Wood flooring for two rooms
- 8) Bathrooms: Wall shelves, light fixtures, grab bars, shower bars, etc.
- 9) Window curtains
- 10) Ceiling fans (2)
- 11) TV, DVD, installation
- 12) Mattson trailer repair
- 13) Putting everything back

There is work for all skill levels, including serving as taxi service as well as food and drink crew. We are expecting 35-40 volunteers on Friday including 10 - 12 from Home Depot, and a large contingent from the Rotary Club of Kona Mauka. We can use EVERYONE at all hours of the day, so please do not feel as though you need to sign up for the entire day or days. This ambitious two day span for a project this large is owing to the nature of the workplace where all residents need to be cleared out.

Light breakfast foods, coffee, cold beverages, and lunch will be provided.

I would like confirmation from everyone as to what hours they think at this time they will be available on both Friday and Saturday. In this way, we can plan ahead of time where everyone is going, and job duties. Please do consider Friday afternoon, as it is expected that some folks will leave early. We need to put the place back into usable condition. Further details will follow as to what tools, paint equipment, safety equipment, tarps, coolers, you might want to bring with you.

As a team, we can do miracles. Mahalo to Child & Family Service's Domestic Abuse Shelter for allowing us this opportunity to give something back to those with a most special need. A home.
